Meet Master Craftsman, Tom McLaughlin, host of PBS TV's Classic Woodworking.
Over his 30-plus year career, Tom has designed and built custom pieces for clients seeking to own pieces that are as much a work of art as they are functional.

Tom McLaughlin Bio

Tom McLaughlin decided to pursue his love for fine furniture making full time when he was in his late twenties. He apprenticed with Master Craftsman P.A. “Pug” Moore of Rocky Mount, NC. Tom & Pug had a very special connection, with Pug becoming a gifted grandfather figure over time. In 1993, Tom set up his first shop in Wilson, NC, building custom period style furniture.

In 2001, Tom began construction on a new shop, a two story 3,600 sq. ft. building on his property in Canterbury, NH. When the shop opened, Tom launched McLaughlin Woods, where he employs apprentices while continuing to design and make custom high-end furniture.


In 2016, Tom shifted his focus from commission work to teaching. He and his wife, Kris, created Epic Woodworking to help further the craft. Tom provides instruction for all skill levels through online courses and in-shop classes.

In addition, Tom opened his shop doors through a membership experience called The Neighborwood, which provides a platform where woodworkers all over the world share stories of “making” to encourage and inspire creativity and design ideas.

Tom is also involved in the Prison Outreach Program, part of the NH Furniture Masters educational efforts. Monthly woodworking seminars are offered, resulting in several inmates having received awards for their work.

Besides being a Master Woodworker and teacher, Tom is the host of PBS TV’s Classic Woodworking and is a frequent contributor to Fine Woodworking Magazine. He is a 25-year member and former Chairman of the New Hampshire Furniture Masters. Tom is the recipient of several awards for his skills as a furniture maker and designer.

T H E P R E S I D E N T ' S C O R N E R

The famous “I WANT YOU FOR U.S. ARMY” campaign to solicit recruits for the military is one of the most successful utilizations of print media of the Federal government. It was illustrated by James Montgomery Flagg shortly after the US declared war against Germany in 1917. The poster has become an iconic advertisement and was in fact so successful, that it was reintroduced with great success during World War II to garner the enlistment of soldiers.

Taking some liberty to change the words of that slogan, WE NEED YOU FOR OUR ANNUAL MEETING that will be held during the regular Monthly Membership Meeting on May 1, beginning at 6:30 pm. What's New at the Shop?

A new Grizzly G0779 heavy duty drill press has been installed in the shop. This drill press provides more precise and larger capacity drilling than the existing Jet and Powermatic drill presses. It is equipped with a two-horsepower motor and six-speed gear box.

Key Features of the Grizzly

- Motor assembly that moves up and down.
- Large work surface with tie-downs and fence. Motorized controller moves table up and down.
- Standard drill press handle and fine adjustment handle.
- Depth limiter

Certification

If members are already drill press certified, a supervisor can show users the location of the controls and how to change gears and operate the table.

If members are not yet certified on the drill presses, they should attend the Miter and Drill Press class that is periodically offered.

Izzie's Pond Animal Rescue & Sanctuary

The Guild recently received a thank you letter for work done by member Jim Gilreath at Izzie's Pond Animal Rescue & Sanctuary. Jim has been supporting this organization for quite some time, building items such as den boxes, platforms, and ramps for foxes, bobcats, raccoons, and otters. Nearly all of these projects have been built from scrap wood from Jim's shop or the Guild shop.

Izzie's Pond is a nonprofit, 501(c)(3) organization that provides rescue, rehabilitation and refuge for injured or orphaned wildlife. Through community outreach, they raise public awareness and appreciation for animals by educating children and adults to coexist with wildlife and to take their share of responsibility for a thriving ecosystem.

Izzie's Pond takes on several hundreds of animals every year, both wild and domestic. Wild animals are rehabilitated and released back into nature. Non-releasable animals are given lifetime sanctuary or placed as educational ambassadors at USDA licensed facilities across the United States.



Birdhouse Contest Winners








